2	There were bombings in London on July 7th, the heir to the throne re-married and England won the Ashes.	
3	The Russian President Putin and American President Bush visited Britain and the M6 Toll Road opened.	
4	Tony Blair resigned and Gordon Brown took over and the High Speed Railway was opened running through the Channel Tunnel.	
5	The majority said 'Yes' to Brexit in the referendum, the first female bishop was installed and Jeremy Corbyn became leader of the Labour Party.
