

Welcome to Blackburn Baptist Church, on December 17th 2023 at 4pm, meeting at Bethesda Chapel.

Whilst some are able to meet in person, others we know are still at home. We hope and pray that you will find this outline of our service helpful, as we seek to worship God as a Church family, wherever we are.

Our Candle-lit Carol service today is being led by Alec, and as the name suggests, the church is lit by lanterns and the Advent Wreath. It follows the traditional 9 Lessons and Carols pattern. Trevor is playing the piano for us today, together with Paul W, Kate and Judith, and they accompany all the carols.

Alec begins with saying:

"What's this excitement all about?

It's really about an encounter with the living God and with Jesus Christ.

He is the one about whom we will be singing today and about whom we are hearing bible readings. We may not yet be finished with selecting and buying Christmas cards and presents. But this afternoon if we open our eyes and ears, hearts and minds we will be made clearly aware of the presence of God; by faith we will understand that the universe was formed at God's command, that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

Enjoy the atmosphere of candles and decorations. But look beyond what you can see to the reality of the presence of the living God. He is longing to speak to you.

He who made and who sustains the world; He whom you and I rejected to go our own way, choosing to remain in darkness rather than turn to and live in the light, He longs to speak to each one of us and to us all this afternoon.

As we begin this afternoon let us pray from our hearts thanking God for this opportunity to be together and to hear from Him.

Musicians and readers please bear in mind that there will be no spoken announcements of what we are about to sing or to read. Please follow the screen behind me. Please stand to sing if possible and please be seated for the readings. Thank you."

The service then proceeds:

Message: The King is coming!?

What a wonderful atmosphere we are enjoying here this afternoon. Singing to the living God and listening to readings about His Son Jesus coming into the world in a creatively as well as safely and carefully prepared environment; against a background of the ever-longer dark days which we experience not just as fewer physical daylight hours but as darkness in the sense of the ever-increasing attacks on our hearts and lives in the world in which we live, a darkness which can so easily stunt or even silence our sense of the wonder of God seen so clearly in the world that he originally made and said was good.

With an appropriate and balanced sense of tradition we are reminding ourselves today of the greatness of God. So how good it is that we are still free in this country to share in this together, free from threats from without and from within. We are so glad and joyful to be together in experiencing not just the message but the truth of the reality of God here with us today. Hallelujah!

We do not need to apologise for talking about the living God and His Living Word. This book in my hands has 66 parts, 39 in what is called the Old Testament and 27 in what we call the New Testament. I hope you have an easily readable copy of this at home. Dig into it like you would attack a garden to clear out the weeds and the dirt and it will feed you like a vegetable garden and amaze you like a display of beautiful flowers. It will be fruitful and nourish you.

Taste and see that the Lord is good! This is our daily bread in a hungry world, a world longing for truth and life and peace; a world seeking for hope and a future, for meaning and purpose, but a world that doubts that these things are possible and is especially not just cautious and suspicious of what churches say and what they actually do, but is openly, directly and publicly loud in its criticism where there is all too frequently an awesome and growing gap between talk and walk, between what we say and what we do.

So as churches we need to apologise not just to the world, but to the Living God, asking Him for forgiveness for the way we lead our lives. This is an important step to take, a very good place to start.

When God created the world He made it out of chaos. He made it out of love. But we people made in the image of God suppress the truth about God and His created world. We so often just don't want to know. What may be known about God is plain to us all because God has made it plain to us all. For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men and women are without excuse.

We live so often without God in the world He created and sustains through the might of His power. We go our own way; we have our own agendas, we live in our own little boxes which we may think are oh so clever and so safe although we know one day we will land up in a box that sadly fits us exactly.

The Bible says, "All of us, like sheep, have gone astray. Each of us has turned to his own way." (Isaiah 53:6a NASB)

All of us have gone the wrong way and we have all fallen short of the glory of God. We have missed the target; we have failed to reach God's goal, that we reflect who He is, His Glory.

All that we think is good about us, even the best things we can and do do, these things are like dirty, filthy rags when God looks down on us and passes his assessment, his judgement on us.

Ignoring God we travel in the wrong direction in a one-way cul-de-sac, with darkness deepening and lengthening its shadows around us as we continue to live separated from our Maker.

The human race that God made to glorify Him has become cut off from Him, from each other, from its environment and we have been become cut off from ourselves. In these four dimensions we are completely lost without Him. Then we try to solve inter-personal problems, environmental problems and being disturbed within our own personalities, lives and being without reference to our Maker or to the Handbook. We have completely lost the plot if we leave God out of the script.

And that would be the end of the story. Sadly for millions of people that??? the tragic end; a life on earth which leads to physical death. Millions have a life on earth which reflects, which mirrors of their own choice the sad truth of spiritual isolation from the living God and leads to eternal, to everlasting death; everlasting "life" without life and without hope.

All of us, like sheep, have gone astray. Each of us has turned to his own way.

But you see thank God that the script doesn't end there. That is not the end of the plot.

We read immediately following these words: "But the LORD has caused the wrongdoing of us all to fall on His only Son Jesus".

We are the lost sheep. But Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He is the One we need to follow and obey.

John 10: 7-11; 14-18

He is the Good Shepherd who says the good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep; and that is exactly what Jesus Christ did, coming to earth and giving his life for us on a cross.

What Jesus says and what He does match up exactly with one another.

He is the One who knows, cares and can be trusted.

Who Jesus really is Colossians 1: 15-20, Philippians 2: 5-11

"Enjoying the joy and majesty of the festive season" films, sports, food

music, art, culture, entertainment,

But what about fixing our eyes on God in Jesus Christ? Jesus is the reason for the season.

Selecting, buying, writing and sending Christmas cards and choosing presents is even in an age of online purchasing opportunities a time-consuming, a thought-consuming and a costly business.

Advent calendars meaning anything but looking forward to celebrating the coming of Jesus Christ into the world are all over the place. Just buy and enjoy, fun and short-lived excitement; 24 different pictures, 24 different sweets, 24 different puzzles and then? 24 different videos of sports events maybe? 24 pictures of those who have left us in the last year?

"Taste and see that the Lord is good"

To whom have we given our allegiance? With whom are we connected? Whom are we following? Jesus Christ alone? Or have we added Jesus to a plethora of other so-called "gods" and we are backing all the horses in the race at the same time? The Bible makes it very clear. The only way to God is through His Son Jesus Christ. In John 14.6 Jesus say, "I am the Way the truth and the life; NO-ONE COMES TO THE FATHER EXCEPT THROUGH ME."

Or do we still want to hold on to other so-called "gods" and other things?

Psalm 115 other "gods"

Do we like "mix and match"?

Perhaps we don't like being tied down or tying ourselves down to one particular way of thinking and behaving?

A diverse lifestyle, a free-thinking approach,; some eastern thinking here and a bit of esoteric there and so on; nice and free, genuinely non-committal and without real cost to or loss of the control of our lives.

Do we like to pick and choose our ideas and thoughts about life and about truth, about our past, present and future and our thoughts about God?

But Jesus said, leave everything and follow me. Leave all these other ways of thinking and behaving and be my disciple. There is only one way to be forgiven our wrongs and to have peace and life and that is through Jesus Christ.

Material things, a "good" career, an important job or a particular role in the secular world or in a "church"

On what basis do we make our life decisions?

Mt. 6:33 everything you need will be given to you: at exactly the right time, at exactly the right place and exactly as you need it.

It's not basically, primarily, mainly and exclusively about what we have done for God eg coming to church, trying to be kind to family and neighbours or work colleagues, being generous with our gifts or whatever, though these attitudes and ways of thinking and behaving may be signs of a genuine faith but it is not about what we have done are doing or will do for God but about what He has done for us...

The problem is with our heart. We have hearts of stone; hard, proud, arrogant, self-seeking; God sets us free from wrong and gives us hearts that live and breathe, in which He lives through His Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is God in us, the hope of glory, the hope of the glory that we have catastrophically and completely failed to demonstrate without Him because the glory belongs alone to the Living God.

The God who made the world comes into the world as a man like those He makes and sustains. Why? Because in His love and grace, mercy and compassion He knows the only way for men and women to be restored to Him is through His paying the penalty for the wrongs that we have done. You see God is just. The scenario, the rules, the background, the context is completely clear. The soul that sins dies. The death rate wherever and whenever is 1 per person.

Jesus comes as King into the world. He is the only King who became a baby. He is the only human being who never did wrong. He paid the price for our wrongs. And even if He had known that only one person would respond to his call and ask forgiveness He would have come into the world and died-for YOU. For any of us and for each of us.

So where are you and I this afternoon? Are we listening to what the living God is saying to us? Do we have ears to hear and hearts and minds fully open to listen to and obey Him?

It is not the presents we buy and give or which we receive that I am really talking about, though these are real enough. I am talking about God's presence. Knowing the presence of God 24/7 is something very, very special. May each one of us know the presence of God with us each day and each night until the King comes again and takes us to the homes that He is preparing for us in heaven.

Let us finally not forget what it cost the Son of God to come to earth as a baby and give his life for us. But let us also not forget that following Him, becoming and remaining His followers and disciples will cost us our all as well. For if we want to share in His glory we must also share in His sufferings.
