Alec read 1 Corinthans 11, 23–27, as he welcomed those who love Jesus to join in this time of communion.

For I received from the Lord,

Alec lifted the Cup, saying "In the same way, after supper, Jesus took the cup and said 'This is the new covenant in my blood, do this whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.' We waited until all had been served before drinking together as a sign of our unity in Christ. "Whoever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lords death until he comes again. Grant your wisdom, guidance and inspiration, so that many will hear and respond in the name of Christ. Amen.

Bible reading Psalm 40 Jane Farmer

I waited patiently for the Lord; he turned to me and heard my cry. He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear the Lord and put their trust in him. Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, who does not look to the proud, to those who turn aside to false gods. Many, Lord my God, are the wonders you have done, the things you planned for us. None can compare with you; were I to speak and tell of your deeds, they would be too many to declare. Sacrifice and offering you did not desire - but my ears you have opened; burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not require. Then I said, 'Here I am, I have come - it is written about me in the scroll. I desire to do your will, my God; your law is within my heart.' -for a medical appointment

-for someone to answer our telephone call; "you are no. 27 in the queue."

-for God to listen

-for God to answer

-for the church to grow

-for a change of circumstances

-for God to get us out of the mess we have got ourselves into

We are used to waiting.

1.1 But how do we wait?

Are we frustrated having to wait? Discouraged? With a sense of hopelessness thinking nothing is ever going to happen or change?

Advertising and marketing try to persuade us not to wait. Decide now, buy now, travel now. Buy on credit now. The terms have never been and will not become better! You do not need to wait. Why wait?

Waiting for God is at the heart of living by faith. "But those who wait on the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31, NKJV)

1.2 Whom do we wait for? For the living God! Really?

When it suits us? When we think He will let us do what we want? As long as what God seems to be saying fits in with our ideas and concepts of what we should be doing?

Or because he is who he says he is: all-powerful, all-knowing. Loving and caring. Just and holy? And because as our Lord and Saviour we long to obey Him.

2) WHAT IS THE RESULT OF OUR PATIENT WAITING?

God turns to us.

God hears our cry.

God acts.

2.1 What does God do and what follows from God's intervention? "He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire."

This doesn't necessarily mean that He takes us out of the situation we are in although He may do that. But He prevents us slipping and sinking. He strengthens our faith. We rest on Him the rock. He is our refuge and

our strength. He holds us in His hands. He enables us to stand in the evil day. Psalm 37:1–7 emphasises the fact that the Lord delivers those who wait on Him and commit themselves to His will.

In the first book of the Old Testament, Jacob's son Joseph experienced the calamity of being thrown into a pit, in a very literal sense. His brothers despised him and tried to get rid of him by putting him into a pit. However, in God's providence, Judah, one of the brothers, persuaded the others to draw him out of the pit and sell him to Ishmaelite traders going to Egypt. God used this deep experience in Joseph's life and in the life of His people Israel for their good.

God's grace leads us into the pit. God's grace sustains us in the pit. God's grace will bring us out. And while in the pit, keep looking up. In the pit, there is only one place to look, and that is up.

The Bible does not record any literal events in David's life such as being trapped in a pit. Rather, this is additional poetry describing how deeply desperate David's plight was. David's warlike life was full of near-death experiences, some of which seemed so hopeless that they were like being in a refuse tip or slimy swamp. One can imagine being abandoned in a cavernous hole in the ground filling with water, mud, and slime. In such a predicament, in such a difficult situation it is impossible to get a foothold, but the Lord reached down to David, answered his cry for help, and pulled him to safety. David says the Lord set his feet on a rock and made his steps secure. The imagery indicates that the Lord rescued David from his enemies and provided security for him.

That is what He does for us if we decide to follow Him. Our circumstances may not change but our attitude to them, our mindset will be changed. Our minds, our response, our behaviour will reflect the Lord as we are transformed into His image from one degree of glory to another.

The Old Testament prophet of God Jeremiah was thrown into a pit because he was prophesying against the city of Jerusalem and its people. He was warning them that if they did not repent and turn away from their wicked ways, the city would be destroyed by the Babylonians. The officials of the city, who were angered by his message, accused him of demoralising the soldiers and undermining the war effort. They then threw him into a cistern of mud with no water.

The Lord is the reason Jeremiah is in the pit. He told Jeremiah, "Stand up and say to them whatever I command you." (1:17)

Let me ask the same question again. Why is Jeremiah in the pit? Jeremiah was in the pit because of God and his Word. He's there because Judah rebelled against God and God decided to let Judah suffer in exile at the hands of the Babylonians. He's in the pit because God, in his mercy, gave Judah another opportunity to repent, not wanting anyone to perish. He's in the pit because God gave Jeremiah the grace in this call to be the tool he used to call back to repentance. He wants the wayward to return and trust in him as Saviour. We are the ones today who are called to proclaim God's grace and mercy, after people hear of their sin.

2.2 What does God do? "He set my feet upon a rock and gave me a firm place to stand."

We stand on the Word of God. No more and no less.

In the book of Numbers from chapter 1 we see God's people as an army of serving soldiers and faithful worshippers

3) WHAT IS OUR RESPONSE AND RESPONSIBILITY?

3.1 We become a worshipping people.

"He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God."

3.2 The church of God, the body of Christ grows.

"Many will see and fear the Lord and put their trust in him."
